Activities which encourage dialogue

- Offer more interactive opportunities between members
- Meet and greet for new members and anyone interested... can be combined with introducing committees, etc.
- Professional meetings that encourage dialogue & debate between different schools of psychoanalysis
- More coordination with other clinical orientations such as: Jungians, neurologists, family therapists – panels where we share ideas & find inspiration & common ground
